## What is University of Scouting?

University of Scouting is a day-long event combining several training opportunities into one exciting learning opportunity for all adult Scouters!

To recognize your success in attending and completing the various courses offered, University of Scouting offers a degree program in three areas – Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, and Venturing – with some Elective and District courses to round out the curriculum. Participation on the degree program is **not** mandatory, however, and course may be taken regardless of whether or not New Leaders Essentials has been completed.

### The Degree Process

#### Basic Requirements

- For all Colleges, the basic eligibility is to have completed the New Leaders Essentials. That is all that is necessary to attend any of the Colleges or courses.

#### Degree Requirements

- It is not a requirement that a student pursue a degree to attend the University. You may take courses from any College and from the list of Elective courses. To attain a degree in one of the Colleges, however, the requirements outlined below must be met.

### Associate of Scouting

**Prerequisites:** None

**Requirements:** The Associate's Degree is awarded to a first-time student upon completion of six hours of courses at the University. You may take any courses from any College.

### Bachelor of Scouting

**Prerequisites:** Hold an Associate of Scouting Degree earned at a prior University of Scouting Session or an Associates of Cub Scouting Degree earned at a prior POW WOW, College of Cub Scouting event.

**Requirements:** The Bachelor's Degree is awarded to a student upon completion of six hours of courses **after** earning the Associate's Degree. You may take any courses from any College.

### Master's of Scouting

**Prerequisites:** Hold a Bachelor of Scouting Degree earned at a prior University of Scouting Session or a Bachelor of Cub Scouting Degree earned at a prior POW WOW, College of Cub Scouting event.

**Requirements:** The Master's Degree is awarded to a student upon completion of six hours of courses **after** earning the Bachelor's Degree. You may take any courses from any College.

## College of Scouting Courses

**Cub 01 – Recognition/Awards – Gary Holewinski** - giving the boys, not the adult leaders, their moment in the sun. How we do this.

**Cub 02 – Blue and Gold– Gary Holewinski** -celebrating the birth of Scouting or a giant all-in-one awards ceremony with awards, Arrow of Light and Crossover. If you're doing the giant all-in-one are you going so long that folks are sneaking out before the end? Find out how to separate these individual events, make them more meaningful, keep your folks interest AND make your life easier.

**Cub 03 -Webelos Keepsake Arrows – Myriah Crimmins** - Get great ideas for your Arrow of Light ceremonies and keepsakes for those scouts crossing over.

**Cub 04 – Games for Cubs – Eric & Myriah Crimmins** - indoor, outdoor, and quiet games.

**Cub 05 - Knots for Cubs – Gary Panczner** - Are you all thumbs when using rope? Learn your knots before your Cub Scouts do! This workshop will teach you the five basic knots learned in the Webelos program. Why not give this session a try?

**Cub 06 - Webelos-to-Scout Transition – Eric Crimmins-** If you are a Webelos leader, or are going to be one soon, this is the course for you! Find out what you need to know to help your Webelos Scouts make the transition from the Cub Scout Pack to the Boy Scout Troop.

**Cub 7 – LNT for Cub Scouts: Front Country Camping – Rodger Phillips** - This course teaches Cub Scout leaders how to apply the principles of Leave No Trace to their front country camping program and provides an excellent pack meeting topic.

**Cub 8 – Blast Off to Adventure – Eric Crimmins** – Use rockets as a vehicle to teach your boys a variety of lessons. Come participate in a hands on class where we'll use air, water, and other rockets to reinforce a variety of character connections, fulfill advancement electives, learn a bit of science, and just have fun. Conditions permitting we'll head outside for a launch. **(2 hours)**

**Cub 9 - Sports and Academics Program – Gary Holewinski** - An overview of the Sports and Academics Belt Loop and Pin program. Learn about ways to include these into your den and pack activities. Gary H.

**Cub 10 - Keep 'em Active thru Summer – Gary Holewinski** - Building a solid year round Cub Scout program means putting on a great summer event schedule. We will explore organization, advertising and benefits, while evaluating zany activities to keep your unit's scouting family interested and involved.

**Cub 11 – Budgeting for the Pack – Bob Quick** - Learn how to plan a budget for the ideal year of Cub Scouting in your pack.

**Cub 12 - Cub Crafts – Gary Holewinski** - Something old, a few things new, everything borrowed and no one walks away blue. An update of past crafts sessions with many of your old favorites and some brand new crafts. There is also a group of crafts designed to help with the Webelos Craftsman Activity pin. There will be enough crafts to keep your Cubs busy with crafts for every rank.

**Cub 13 - Camping for Cub Scouts – James Whitehead** - Highlights include policies and requirements; pack, district and council programs; training and resources; Cub Day Camp at Miakonda.

**Scout 01 - Ceremonies and Courts of Honor – John Bailey** - Learn about opening, closing, individual and group recognition. Make your Courts of Honor memorable.

**Scout 02 - Knots and Lashings for Boy Scouts – Gary Panczner** - If you've mastered Knots for Cubs you are ready to move on to this more advanced course that shows you the knots and lashings Boy Scouts are expected to learn as they move through the Scouting program.

**Scout 03 – Leave No Trace – Rodger Phillips** - This course will be a basic overview of the Leave No Trace principles and their application to camping by Boy Scout Troops and Venture Crews.

**Scout 04 – Geocoutingg – Joe Meyer** – Learn all about Geocaching - the exciting new sport that uses GPS navigation to find hidden treasures. Learn how you can use it to provide outdoor adventure with advancement, recruiting, retention, and fun!

**Scout 05 – Campfire Cooking - John Bailey** – Learn the different methods of cooking on a campout: foil cooking, Dutch oven, how to cook a Turkey!

**Scout 06 – On the Trail of the Eagle – Roger Grieve** – Help your Life Scouts with their project selection their Eagle application and preparation for their Board of Review.

**Scout 07 - The Scoutmaster Conference – Gary Holewinski** - This course reviews the requirements and purpose of Scoutmaster's conferences and explores ways to make the conferences valuable to both the Scout and the Scoutmaster. Ideas for and approaches to Scoutmaster's conferences for Scouts all the way through Eagle will be presented.

**Scout 08 NYLT Scoutmaster Orientation – Pat Sutherland & Chuck Gafner** - Overview of what your Scouts learn when they attend National Youth Leadership training (NYLT). This orientation is required for Scoutmasters to receive the Scoutmaster Key.

**Scout 09 - Troop Boards of Review - Charlie Horne** - There will be a discussion on the troop's advancement committee responsibility in conducting quality rank advancement boards of review for all ranks, including the Eagle rank. Examples of kinds of questions that might be asked will be included.

**Scout 10 - Planning the Troop Court of Honor – Charlie Horne** - A "How to" on the importance of the Court of Honor and recognizing each Scout as special--make them memorable. Planning, program, and delegating.

**Scout 11 – The Advancement Program and On-Line Advancement - Kathy Bomer**- Learn about the Advancement Program and On-line Advancement as a key method to the Scouting program or even more specifically a course on Kick-Starting the Advancement Process for New Scouts.

**Scout 12 – Budgeting for the Troop – Bob Quick** - learn how to plan a budget for the ideal year of Scouting in your Troop.

**Scout 13 – How to Build an Awesome Troop – Scott Gill**– Get the inside scoop on what you need to know to build the best troop possible.

**Scout 14 –Eating On the Trail– Myriah Crimmins** – Learn how to pack food for the trail. Keep it light weight, but have the rest of camp wish they had you pack food for them. Everything from day long to overnights. Can also offer a talk on the different types of back packing stoves that are out there.

**Venturing 01 – Venture Leader Basic Training – Scott Moffett**

One of two courses need by a Venture Crew advisor to be considered trained. Prerequisite "This is Scouting" (formerly "New Leader Essentials"). (3 hrs)

**Venturing 02 - High Adventure for Older Scouts & Venturers – James**

**Whitehead** - Highlights include the 5 W's and an H; National bases, council contingents & unit opportunities; Other councils' programs; independent providers.

**Elective 01 - Leatherworking – Don Maier** - Get hands on experience with leatherworking activities to share with your scouts.

**Elective 02 - Scouting the Net - Russ Eby** – Are you a new leader trying to figure out where to start? Have you been a leader for a few years and are looking for new ideas & activities for your unit? Come find out what information & resources are available on the Internet to help you!

**Elective 03 – Flag Etiquette – Ed Taylor** - Flag procedures including proper saluting, raising, lowering, and much more in this "Respect for the Flag" oriented session.

**Elective 04 – The Essential Guide to Safe Scouting – Glenda Bowman**

What every unit needs to know to keep their scouting outings safe and fun!

**Elective 05 - Introduction to the Order of the Arrow - Brent Bomer** - Perfect

for non-members curious about the OA and new brothers. This session will give an overview on the purpose and principles as well as clarifying any questions. The seemingly complex structure of the OA and different leadership opportunities will be explained all making becoming a member easier.

**Elective 06 - Light of Christ & Parvuli Dei – Lori Petrey** – learn about the religious emblems program for Catholic Cub Scouts.

**Elective 07 - Ad Altare Dei & Pope Pius XII** – find out how to implement the Catholic Religious Emblems program for Boy Scouts aged 13 or older.

**Elective 08 - Promoting Religious Emblems Duty to God Promotion Patch – Rodney Cundiff** - \_You may be an expert at Camping, tying knots, and the outdoors, but how much do you know about the Scouting's Religious Emblems programs? This 50 minute program developed by PRAY, will lead you through the steps for using the Duty to God Promotion Patch Program to encourage your Scouts to make a commitment to Duty to God.

**Elective 09 - Great Songs – Rodney Cundiff** - Do you believe that Scouts love to sing? They just need the right atmosphere, fun songs, and an enthusiastic leader. You can provide this (even if you can't carry a tune in a bucket!). This 50 minute program will equip you with tools to effectively incorporate great songs into all your Scouting activities.

**Elective 10 – Safe Swim Defense & Safety Afloat – Glenda Bowman** - Whether boating or swimming, it is the responsibility of every Scout Leader to make sure that they know how to help their scouts enjoy these activities in a safe manner. "Safety Afloat" and "Safe Swim Defense" are the two courses which will ensure that their scouts have a fun, but safe time when in the water. **2 hr course**

**Basic 01 – Cub Leader Specific: Modules 1 & 2 (Lee Schultz)** - The first two modules of the **NEW** Cub Leader Position Specific training! To be followed by Position Specific training later in the day. **(New Leader Essentials is NOT required to be taken before you take this course, but it is highly recommended.) 2 hour course**

**Basic 02 – Tiger Den Leader Specific (Jamie Meyers)** - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Tiger Den Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a Tiger den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

**Basic 03 – Den Leader Specific (Joe Meyer)** - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Wolf/Bear Den Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

**Basic 04 – Webelos Leader Specific (Russ Eby)** - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Webelos Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

**Basic 05 – Cubmaster Specific (John Nyers)** - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Cubmasters will attend this course to get information specific to running a pack, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

**Basic 06 – Pack Committee Specific (Roger Grieve)** - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Pack Committee Members will attend this course to get information specific to the administrative functions of a pack, including the annual planning conference, setting up a calendar, and coordinating with other parents. **2 hour course**

**Basic 07 – Pack Trainer Specific (Lee Schultz)** - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Pack Trainers will attend this course to get information specific to this new positioning Cub Scouting. **2 hour course**

**Basic 08 – Scoutmaster & Asst. Scoutmaster Leader Specific (Patti Huckabba)** - One of three courses needed by Scoutmasters and Asst. Scoutmasters to be considered basic trained (along with “This is Scouting” and “Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills”). **All day program**

**Basic 09 – Youth Protection Training (Ed Taylor)** - learn about the latest issues and concerns we face as leaders who want to present a safe program for the youth we serve. **2 hours**

**Commissioner 01 - Unit Lifesaving - Turning Impending Disaster Into A Promising Future – Ed Taylor** Time can truly be of essence when a unit is in immediate danger of collapse. If prepared, a commissioner can turn a unit facing impending disaster into unit whose future is bright with promise. This session begins by setting the stage for identifying a unit in need of a lifesaving commissioner, followed by a discussion of the basic steps in unit lifesaving. We will then explore real-life examples of units in need of immediate assistance and options available to a commissioner that can lead to success.

**Commissioner 02 - Unit Visitation - Service To Your Units Begins Here** Service to your units begins with the unit visit. This session will provide valuable insights from some of our most effective commissioners on how you can be a true help to your units. We will then explore a variety of easy-to-implement tools and techniques you can use to make your unit visit a success.

**Commissioner 03 - The Commissioner's “Top Ten” Retention List** Top Ten lists are everywhere, but few are as meaningful as the top ten list to be covered in this session. This session will explore the top ten findings of a recent formal and extensive research project in Northern Ohio regarding recruitment and retention at all levels of Scouting. Commissioners and non-commissioners alike will leave this session with a new appreciation for the keys to success as we begin the 2010 Scouting year. **(2 hr session)**

**Commissioner 04 - Successful Unit Charter Renewal** - Rechartering can be a major challenge to unit leaders at all levels of Scouting. Failure to recharter properly can lead to serious problems for both the youth and the leaders in that unit. As a Unit Commissioner, if you understand the on-line rechartering process you will be prepared to offer real assistance to your unit leaders. Unit charter renewal is just around the corner. Here is your chance to learn exactly how the process works. We will also present some great ideas for helping your units register on time with minimal loss in membership and leaders.

**Commissioner 05 - Cub Scout Roundtable Commissioner Forum** -

Come have fun sharing ideas about how to plan show-stopping Cub Scout roundtable programs. Learn the secrets of a roundtable commissioner known for programs that fill adults with excitement and fill the room month after month. Designed for Cub Scout Roundtable Commissioners and Cub Scout Roundtable Commissioner staff members but certainly open to everyone, this session will cover the Cub Scout roundtable planning cycle, resource materials, promotion and publicity, roundtable location, and a some great new ideas of particular interest to roundtable commissioners at the Cub Scout level.

**Commissioner 06 - Boy Scout Roundtable Commissioner Forum**

Packed with the best ideas from three councils with successful roundtable programs, join us for some great ideas for rejuvenating your Boy Scout Roundtable program. Boy Scout Roundtable Commissioners and Boy Scout Roundtable Commissioner staff members, new and experienced, will enjoy this outstanding presentation.

## Special for Youth Leaders

### Troop Leadership Training – Pat Sutherland

Troop Leadership Training is the first course in the new Youth Leadership Training Continuum (which also included National Youth Leadership Training and National Youth Advanced Experience) which is designed to help scouts learn what a leader needs to Be – Know – Do!

Completion of this course entitles a Scout to where the “Trained” strip in his uniform.



### Den Chief Training – Chris Hammye & Kym Sloane

Den Chiefs are older Boy Scouts who help Den Leaders provide a full Cub Scout program to boys. They are a valuable resource for Cub Scouting and Cub Scout leaders. This class will teach boys wishing to be den chiefs how to lead Cub Scouts in games, songs, contests, and skits. They will learn how to work with boys and adults and gain a better understanding of their responsibilities.



### Chaplain's Aide – Doug Seidl

The purpose of this program is to Make the 12th point of the Scout Law more meaningful in life, promote a greater understanding of and appreciation for all religions, and provide Boy Scouts with the opportunity to work with an ordained member of the clergy, thereby gaining insight into the religious professional life.
