What is University of Scouting?

University of Scouting is a day-long event combining several training opportunities into one exciting learning opportunity for all adult Scouters!

To recognize your success in attending and completing the various courses offered, University of Scouting offers a degree program in three areas – Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, and Venturing – with some Elective and District courses to round out the curriculum. Participation on the degree program is **not** mandatory, however, and course may be taken regardless of whether or not Basic Leader Training has been completed.

The Degree Process

Basic Requirements

- For all Colleges, the basic eligibility is to have completed Youth Protection Training and This is Scouting. That is all that is necessary to attend any of the Colleges or courses.

Degree Requirements

- It is not a requirement that a student pursue a degree to attend the University. You may take courses from any College and from the list of Elective courses. To attain a degree in one of the Colleges, however, the requirements outlined below must be met.

Associate of Scouting

Prerequisites: None

Requirements: The Associate's Degree is awarded to a first-time student upon completion of six hours of courses at the University. You may take any courses from any College.

Bachelor of Scouting

Prerequisites: Hold an Associate of Scouting Degree earned at a prior University of Scouting Session or an Associates of Cub Scouting Degree earned at a prior POW WOW, College of Cub Scouting event.

Requirements: The Bachelor's Degree is awarded to a student upon completion of six hours of courses **after** earning the Associate's Degree. You may take any courses from any College.

Master's of Scouting

Prerequisites: Hold a Bachelor of Scouting Degree earned at a prior University of Scouting Session or a Bachelor of Cub Scouting Degree earned at a prior POW WOW, College of Cub Scouting event.

Requirements: The Master's Degree is awarded to a student upon completion of six hours of courses **after** earning the Bachelor's Degree. You may take any courses from any College.

College of Cub Scouting

Cub 01 – Cub Scouts 2010 – The New Delivery Method – Paula Ball – This session will introduce Cub Scout Leaders to the changes in the Cub Scout program that went into effect September 2010, including the way we present the program to the boys and the resources that will help us do it!

Cub 02 –Knots for Cubs – Gary Paczner - Are you all thumbs when using rope? Learn your knots before your Cub Scouts do! This workshop will teach you the five basic knots learned in the Webelos program. Why not give this session a try?

Cub 03 - Webelos-to-Scout Transition – Eric Crimmins - If you are a Webelos leader, or are going to be one soon, this is the course for you! Find out what you need to know to help your Webelos Scouts make the transition from the Cub Scout Pack to the Boy Scout Troop. (Scout 08)

Cub 4 – Blast Off to Adventure- Eric Crimmins - Use rockets as a vehicle to teach your boys a variety of lessons. Come participate in a hands on class where we'll use air, water, and other rockets to reinforce a variety of character connections, fulfill advancement electives, learn a bit of science, and just have fun. Conditions permitting we'll head outside for a launch. **(2 hours)**

Cub 5 - Sports and Academics Program – Gary Holewinski - An overview of the Sports and Academics Belt Loop and Pin program. Learn about ways to include these into your den and pack activities.

Cub 6 - Cub Crafts – Gary Holewinski- Something old, a few things new, everything borrowed and no one walks away blue. An update of past crafts sessions with many of your old favorites and some brand new crafts. There is also a group of crafts designed to help with the Webelos Craftsman Activity pin. There will be enough crafts to keep your Cubs busy with crafts for every rank.

Cub 7 – Cub Camping – Mike Salmons - Put the OUTING back in SCOUTING!!! Pack and Den Outings! Cub Scout Camping! Understand the importance of family camping for your pack. Find out the how to, why, and where to go. Make family camping an annual event in your pack. (This is not BALOO Training)

Cub 8 – Cub Scout Magic - Bring Magic to Your Den or Pack by learning basic magic tricks! Learn how to help your packs and dens have eye-opening magical fun while still earning awards!

Cub 9 - Intro to Camping Equipment - Mike Salmons - New to camping and don't know whether to buy down or polyfill? How do you select a pack; shoes, boots, socks, or raingear? What steps should be taken to properly maintain both personal and group equipment? Here's the help you've been looking for.

Cub 10 – I'm Trained, So Now What? –Eric Crimmins – This course is designed to answer the questions you don't get to ask during the on-line Cub Leader Specific modules, and maybe didn't think to ask during the live classes either.

Cub 11 - Cub Scouting Awards – Gary Holewinski - We all know at least one Cub Scout that whipped thru the rank requirements in about 6 weeks and did all the electives in 6 weeks, too. Now what? Learn how to help that Cub Scout earn the Outdoor Activity, Conservation, Emergency Preparedness, and BSA Family awards.

Cub 12 – Games for Cubs – Myriah Crimmins – learn about indoor, outdoor, and quiet games for Cub Scouts.

Cub 13 – Cub Scout Skits – Myriah Crimmins - Learn skits and techniques to put on a great show. From Tiger to Webelos to Leaders, we have something for everyone. Be ready to smile and create laughs.

Cub 14 - Cooking with Cubs – Myriah Crimmins - From no cooking snacks to foil packs, get ideas for yummy snacks and meals that every boy will enjoy. We will even cover alternatives for common food allergies.

College of Boy Scouting

Scout 01 - Ceremonies and Courts of Honor – John Bailey - Learn about opening, closing, individual and group recognition. Make your Courts of Honor memorable.

Scout 02 - Knots and Lashings for Boy Scouts – Gary Panczner - If you've mastered Knots for Cubs you are ready to move on to this more advanced course that shows you the knots and lashings Boy Scouts are expected to learn as they move through the Scouting program.

Scout 03 – Leave No Trace – Rodger Phillips - This course will be a basic overview of the Leave No Trace principles and their application to camping by Boy Scout Troops and Venture Crews.

Scout 04 – Geocaching - Learn all about Geocaching - the exciting new sport that uses GPS navigation to find hidden treasures. Learn how you can use it to provide outdoor adventure with advancement, recruiting, retention, and fun!

Scout 05 – Campfire Cooking - John Bailey – Learn the different methods of cooking on a campout: foil cooking, Dutch oven, how to cook a Turkey!

Scout 06 – On the Trail of the Eagle – Roger Grieve – Help your Life Scouts with their project selection their Eagle application and preparation for their Board of Review.

Scout 07 - NYLT Scoutmaster Orientation – Pat Sutherland - Overview of what your Scouts learn when they attend National Youth Leadership training (NYLT). This orientation is required for Scoutmasters to receive the Scoutmaster Key.

Scout 08 - Webelos to Scout Transition – Eric Crimmins - Learn what the troop's role is in helping Webelos join your Boy Scout Troop. (Cub 03)

Scout 09 - Merit Badge Counselor Orientation – Rick St. John - National syllabus is presented for this training of the Merit Badge Counselor and Merit Badge Process. Course content includes Coaching and Counseling tips, Youth Protection Training issues and "no more, no less".

Scout 10 - Scoutmaster's Role in the Boy-Led Troop – Alan Bernard - Ways the adult leaders can facilitate the boy-led troop and encouraging youth to plan the troop meetings activities.

Scout 11 –Eating On the Trail– Myriah Crimmins – Learn how to pack food for the trail. Keep it light weight, but have the rest of camp wish they had you pack food for them. This session covers everything from day long to overnights and the different types of back packing stoves that are out there. **(2 hrs)**

Scout 12 - How to Run an Effective PLC – Bob Quick - The Patrol Leader's Council (PLC) is vital to a healthy troop. Learn how to conduct an effective meeting and keep participants focused. **(Same as Y04)**

Scout 13 - How to Conduct a Board of Review – Kathy Bomer - This workshop will train troop committee members and others in the purposes of the board of review, offering suggestions for the types of questions that can or should be asked.

Scout 14 – Introduction to Boy Scouts - Alan Bernard - Prerequisites: A son moving into Boy Scouts, but not required Topics covered will include an overview of the Boy Scout Troop Organizational Structure, how and where you fit in, Summer Camp, and some differences between Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts that they don't tell you about.

College of Venturing

Ven 01 - Super Trip Planning – Scott Moffett - For Venture Crews and Boy Scout Troops looking at planning a Super trip. Destination selection, funding, organization, transportation, equipment, tour permits, insurance, etc.

Ven 02 - Conducting a Youth Officers Seminar and Annual Planning Meeting- Terri Phillips - This course instructs Leaders and Youth on the proper way to conduct these two key activities within the Venturing program to ensure trained officers that can provide a well run program.

Ven 03 - Venturing Roundtable - This session is designed to bring Venture Leaders and Youth together to discuss the current state of Venturing, what is currently needed to foster the future growth and discuss the possibility of re-starting a VOA (Venture Officers Association) for Youths and ESC Venture Committee for Adults. **(2 hrs)**

College of Commissioners

Commissioner 01 - Unit Lifesaving - Turning Impending Disaster Into A Promising Future

Time can truly be of essence when a unit is in immediate danger of collapse. If prepared, a commissioner can turn a unit facing impending disaster into a unit whose future is bright with promise. This session begins by setting the stage for identifying a unit in need of a lifesaving commissioner, followed by a discussion of the basic steps in unit lifesaving. We will then explore real-life examples of units in need of immediate assistance and options available to a commissioner that can lead to success.

Commissioner 02 - Unit Visitation - Service To Your Units Begins Here

Service to your units begins with the unit visit. This session will provide valuable insights from some of our most effective commissioners on how you can be a true help to your units. We will then explore a variety of easy-to-implement tools and techniques you can use to make your unit visit a success.

Commissioner 03 - The Commissioner's "Top Ten" Retention List Top Ten lists are everywhere, but few are as meaningful as the top ten list to be covered in this session. This session will explore the top ten findings of a recent formal and extensive research project in Northern Ohio regarding recruitment and retention at all levels of Scouting. Commissioners and non-commissioners alike will leave this session with a new appreciation for the keys to success as we begin the 2010 Scouting year. **(2 hr session)**

Commissioner 04 - Successful Unit Charter Renewal - Rechartering can be a major challenge to unit leaders at all levels of Scouting. Failure to recharter properly can lead to serious problems for both the youth and the leaders in that unit. As a Unit Commissioner, if you understand the on-line rechartering process you will be prepared to offer real assistance to your unit leaders. Unit charter renewal is just around the corner. Here is your chance to learn exactly how the process works. We will also present some great ideas for helping your units register on time with minimal loss in membership and leaders.

Commissioner 05 – Cub Scout Roundtable Commissioner, Roundtable Staff Basic Training, and Boy Scout Roundtable Commissioner Training – Mary Lee Foley

Commissioner 05 - Cub Scout Roundtable Commissioner and Staff Basic Training, and Boy Scout Roundtable Commissioner Training - While a Scouter can join us at any time during the day, the complete session is required to earn the Scouter's Key. Cub Scout and Boy Scout information will be presented together, so anyone who attends the full session will be trained for both.

Roundtable Basic Training acquaints the roundtable team with the aims, principles and specifics of their roles and responsibilities. Roundtable Basic Training assists the roundtable team in developing the methods and techniques necessary to present materials and teach skills at roundtable in

an interesting way. Roundtable commissioners, roundtable staff members, and council and district volunteers and professionals would benefit from a formal discussion of the roundtable program as would enthusiastic, experienced adults who have been identified as potential roundtable team members.

We will take breaks at the same times as other classes, so those who cannot attend the full session can enter and leave at those times.

We expect to cover "The Roundtable" and "Staff Management" in the first hour, "Planning" and "Promotion" in the second hour, "Program Pizzazz" and "Displays, Games, Ceremonies and more" in the third hour. After lunch, we will wrap up with "Cub Scouts - Helping to build a stronger program" and "Boy Scouts - Program Feature Presentation"

Electives

Elective 01 - Leatherworking – Don Maier - Get hands on experience with leatherworking activities to share with your scouts.

Elective 02 - Scouting the Net - Russ Eby – Are you a new leader trying to figure out where to start? Have you been a leader for a few years and are looking for new ideas & activities for your unit? Come find out what information & resources are available on the Internet to help you!

Elective 03 – Flag Etiquette – Ed Taylor - Flag procedures including proper saluting, raising, lowering, and much more in this "Respect for the Flag" oriented session.

Elective 04 - Promoting Religious Emblems Duty to God Promotion Patch – Rodney Cundiff - You may be an expert at Camping, tying knots, and the outdoors, but how much do you know about the Scouting's Religious Emblems programs? This 50 minute program developed by PRAY, will lead you through the steps for using the Duty to God Promotion Patch Program to encourage your Scouts to make a commitment to Duty to God.

Elective 05 - Great Songs – Rodney Cundiff - Do you believe that Scouts love to sing? They just need the right atmosphere, fun songs, and an enthusiastic leader. You can provide this (even if you can't carry a tune in a bucket!). This 50 minute program will equip you with tools to effectively incorporate great songs into all your Scouting activities.

Elective 06 – Rangemaster - Get certified to run the BB Gun and Archery range for district and council events **(3 hour course)**.

Basic 01 – Cub Leader Specific: Modules 1 & 2 – Lee Shultz - The first two modules of the **NEW** Cub Leader Position Specific training! To be followed by Position Specific training later in the day. **2 hour course**

Basic 02 – Tiger Den Leader Specific – Jamie Meyers - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Tiger Den Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a Tiger den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 03 – Den Leader Specific – Joe Meyer - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Wolf/Bear Den Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 04 – Webelos Leader Specific – Russ Eby - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Webelos Leaders will attend this course to get information specific to running a den, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 05 – Cubmaster Specific – John Nyers - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Cubmasters will attend this course to get information specific to running a pack, including how to set up the meetings, plan a calendar, and coordinate with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 06 – Pack Committee Specific – Roger Greive – Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Pack Committee Members will attend this course to get information specific to the administrative functions of a pack, including the annual planning conference, setting up a calendar, and coordinating with other parents. **2 hour course**

Basic 07 – Pack Trainer Specific – Lee Shultz - Upon completion of modules 1 & 2 of the new Cub Leader Specific Training, new Pack Trainers will attend this course to get information specific to this new positioning Cub Scouting. **2 hour course.**

Basic 08 – Scoutmaster & Asst. Scoutmaster Leader Specific – Mike Pierson - One of three courses needed by Scoutmasters and Asst. Scoutmasters to be considered basic trained (along with “This is Scouting” and “Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills”). **ALL DAY COURSE!**

Basic 09 - Troop Committee Challenge - Troop Committee Challenge training is designed to help each troop committee work as a team to improve the Scouting experience for adult and youth members. **3 hour course**

Basic 10 – Youth Protection Training – Ed Taylor - learn about the latest issues and concerns we face as leaders who want to present a safe program for the youth we serve. **2 hour course**

Basic 11 – Chartered Organization Representative Training – Andy Hudec –

This Training is designed to orient the new CORs and serve as a review for those with Scouting experience. *"This is Scouting"* should be completed prior to taking this course. **3 hour course**

Basic 12 – Venture Leader Basic Training – Scott Moffett & Terri Phillips-

One of two courses needed by a Venture Crew advisor to be considered trained and includes Venturing Youth Protection Training as well. Prerequisite "This is Scouting" (formerly "New Leader Essentials"). **3 hour course**

Special for Youth Leaders

Running Start Classes!

Y01 - Troop Leadership Training – Pat Sutherland - Troop Leadership Training is the first course in the new Youth Leadership Training Continuum (which also included National Youth Leadership Training and National Youth Advanced Experience) which is designed to help scouts learn what a leader needs to Be – Know – Do! Completion of this course entitles a Scout to where the "Trained" strip in his uniform. **(3 Hour Program)**



Y02 - Chaplain's Aide – Doug Seidl- The purpose of this program is to Make the 12th point of the Scout Law more meaningful in life, promote a greater understanding of and appreciation for all religions, and provide Boy Scouts with the opportunity to work with an ordained member of the clergy, thereby gaining insight into the religious professional life. **(3 Hour Program)**



Y03 - Den Chief Training - Den Chiefs are older Boy Scouts who help Den Leaders provide a full Cub Scout program to boys. They are a valuable resource for Cub Scouting and Cub Scout leaders. This class will teach boys wishing to be den chiefs how to lead Cub Scouts in games, songs, contests, and skits. They will learn how to work with boys and adults and gain a better understanding of their responsibilities. **ALL DAY PROGRAM!**



Y04 - How to Run an Effective PLC – Bob Quick - The Patrol Leader's Council (PLC) is vital to a healthy troop. Learn how to conduct an effective meeting and keep participants focused. **(Same as SCOUT 12)**

Y05 - Troop Program Planning/Yearly Calendars – Bob Quick – Learn how to create great programs and develop a solid annual troop calendar.

Y06 - How to Run a Troop Meeting – Frank Leinweber - This class will help you learn how to run an effective troop meeting, and give you ideas and instruction for each step of the troop meeting.

Y07 - Eagle Project Resources, Planning, and Execution – Kathy Bomer - A step-by-step formula that will get you through your Eagle project, from conception to completion.
