

Maumee, Ohio, June 27, 2011 – Reuben Charles Miller-Davis has been selected as one of twenty-eight Eagle Scouts from across the country to receive a \$3,000 scholarship provided by the National Eagle Scout Association.

Over 5,000 Eagle Scout scholarship applications were submitted for different Eagle Scout scholarship programs. Reuben Miller-Davis's selection represents recognition of his superb record of accomplishments.

The National Eagle Scout Association, under the direction of the National Development Department Office, Boy Scouts of America, selects the winners through a review committee. This committee also determines the number and size of scholarships to be granted each year to deserving Eagle Scouts graduating from high school.

Besides being a graduating high school senior, applicants must also be currently registered in the Boy Scouts of America, have been granted the Eagle Scout Award prior to submitting the application, and have an SAT or ACT score acceptable to the standards set by the committee. Additionally, each candidate must have demonstrated leadership ability in Scouting and a strong record of participation in activities outside of Scouting, possess a financial need, and have the endorsement of a volunteer or professional Scout leader who knows the applicant personally.

One of the nation's largest youth development organizations, the Boy Scouts of America currently has 2.7 million youth members and over a million adult volunteers.
