WOODITAROD V THE GREAT KLONDIKE RACE:

In the spirit of the Iditarod, your patrol will pick up special cargo (fresh eggs) at four different stops along the course. Your job is to bring home the Fresh Eggs, intact. The eggs that your patrol brings home will be four of the eggs that your patrol will be using for the EGGS-Treme Cooking Station. Your patrol will be assessed a time penalty for each broken egg. Keep in mind you will need these eggs for Saturday Morning. Your patrol will pick up a total of four eggs. Your patrol must bring or barrow a sled, you may find the use of flashlights to be helpful, and a container that you've constructed to insure that your special cargo will survive the trip without being broken. SPL's a good container design will go a long way in making sure your Patrol is successful; you might test a couple designs before you arrive for the weekend. The only limit on the container design is your imagination. As we saw in past years a good container design will help ensure a fast time.

PENALTIES:

- 1 EGG BROKEN ADD 3 MINUTES TO YOUR TIME
- 2 EGGS BROKEN ADD 6 MINUTES TO YOUR TIME
- 3 EGGS BROKEN ADD 9 MINUTES TO YOUR TIME
- 4 EGGS BROKEN ADD 15 MINUTES TO YOUR TIME

PHOTOGRAPHY SCAVENGER HUNT:

Your Patrol will be given a list of people, items, and activities to photograph. These photographs will be used in the power point presentation on Saturday Night. With that in mind, a digital camera should be the camera of choice. The cameras and cords, or memory cards should be brought to Raymer Cabin between 4:00 - 5:00 pm for downloading.

Your Patrol will build a fire then pop three cornels of BSA's finest popping corn. Use only natural wood, it may be dried, but not enhanced in another manner. Consult your Scout Handbook for types of tinder, like dryer lint, wood shavings, etc.

Patrol Equipment: Tinder, Kindling, and Small Wood not much bigger than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch.
(One Leader with a Stop Watch to help time a group)

District Equipment: Matches, Striker, Oil, Popcorn, #10 cans w/handles

Patrol Challenge:

Your Patrol will be given two minutes to read the instructions, then start your Challenge. This will be a timed event with equal importance being given to completing the tasks correctly. The winner will be determined by the fastest time with the most correct task completed.

Patrol Equipment: Three 5' to 6' long staves, three $\frac{1}{4}$ " ropes at least 6' long,
one of your most IMPORTANT resources "The Scout Handbook"
(One Leader with a Stop Watch to help time a group)

Snow Ball:

Your Patrol will play two 15 minute games, against two different teams. The runs will be totaled for both games. If at the end of 15 minutes the Home Team has not finished the inning, The final score will be the score as of the last completed inning. In case of any ties, The first tie breaker will be most runs scored in any single inning. Second tie breaker will a coin flip (lower Troop # will heads and higher Troop # will be tails). The top 4 teams will advance to the afternoon tournament.

EGGS-Treme Cooking Challenge:

Your Patrol will be given the task of preparing the Incredible Edible Egg in many different ways. Your Patrol already will have four of the Eggs from the sled race last night. Your Patrol will come to the Ford Center to receive your additional eggs and other ingredients to help you complete the challenge. Once you have your ingredients and instructions you will proceed to your cabin to prepare the eggs. Once the eggs are prepared, transport the finished products back to the Ford Center for the Station Judges to evaluate. Be prepared to sample your cooking.

Prepare hard boiled eggs:

- Hard Boiled Egg #1 - Peel off the shell, the Station Judge will slice in half to check how done it is.
- Hard Boiled Egg #2 - Make a Deviled Egg (Mayo and Mustard Provided)
- Hard Boiled Egg #3 - Make Egg Salad (Mayo provided) (Patrol will supply two slices of bread)

Prepare French Toast and Scrambled Eggs:

Eggs #4, #5, and #6 Mix these eggs together to make Scrambled Egg Batter. With your mix, make two slices of French Toast, then use what batter is left for Scrambled Eggs.

(District will supply the Eggs); (Patrol will supply two slices of bread and milk)
Maple Syrup and Butter will be available at the Ford Center when you bring your Eggs back.

Prepare an Omelet:

Eggs #7 and #8 - Make an Omelet

District will supply the Eggs, Cheese, (Onion and Ham optional to use).
Patrol may supply other ingredients to make the omelet.

Prepare the following:

- Egg #9 - Fried Egg- yolk hard and may be broken.
- Egg#10 - Sunny Side UP
- Egg#11 - The hard one "Over Easy" - Yolk runny and not broken.
- Egg #12 - A spare Egg, just in case something goes wrong.

District will supply the Eggs.

Patrols will need to provide any equipment (Pots/Pans/Utensils) you feel necessary to complete this event. Patrols may provide Salt and Pepper, and other ingredients which will enhance the taste and presentation of the eggs.
