Pioneer Scout Reservation Rededicated

The Erie Shores Council is proud to honor Richard P. Anderson for his dedication and Scouting spirit by re-dedicating the Richard P. Anderson Pioneer Scout Reservation and The Anderson Preserve in his name.

In 1968 Council President Richard P. Anderson led a group of board members including William Alexander, Jr., Henry Page, Clarence Hickok, Carl Staelin, O. L. Teagarden, Carl O. Gess, Walter Scheuer, Edmund Mizerny and Scout Executive Paul Reinbolt and others, in the raising of funds,

purchase, and initial development of the Pioneer Scout Reservation.

This project was taken on to improve the quality of Camp Miakonda and to prepare for an even greater demand for camping facilities in the Northwest Ohio area. The Reservation was subdivided into three camps. Camp Frontier is being utilized today and achieved record attendance these past two summers with new and exciting activities being added to the programs. The other two undeveloped camps will herein be known as The Anderson Preserve.

For over 53 years Dick Anderson has been closely associated with the success of Scouting. Through his dedication, expertise and hard work, thousands of young people have learned new skills, experienced the out-of-doors, and developed into outstanding citizens.

He has been a member of the Council Executive Board, Advisory Council and Trustee, a Regional BSA member, Capital Campaign leader and Friends of Scouting chair as well as a Troop Chair and Scoutmaster. He was honored in 1966 with the Silver Beaver Award and by the Region in 1972 with the Silver Antelope Award.

The new Inventing Merit Badge was introduced in an event at MIT in Cambridge, Mass. In 1915, the similarly named Invention merit badge was discontinued after only 10 boys had earned it. New BSA Awards

Two new awards have been developed to promote "outdoorism" for Boy Scouts and Varsity Scouts.

The National Outdoor Challenge (No. 430-016) is a unit award that recognizes troops/teams that maintain or increase the amount of outdoor activity when compared to the previous year. The information and application is available here: <http://www.scouting.org/scoutsource/boyscouts/adults/awards.aspx> and is due at the end of 2010. With the release of this award, the National Camping Award has been discontinued; however, patches for camping nights will be available until the inventory is depleted.

The National Outdoor Achievement Award (No. 430-509) recognizes Boy Scouts/Varsity Scouts that excel in outdoor participation. The award consists of five areas of emphasis (camping, aquatics, hiking, riding and adventure) with rigorous requirements to earn each segment. Scouts looking for an extra challenge can earn the National Medal for Outdoor Achievement. This challenging award requires earning at least three of the National Outdoor Achievement segments, planning and leading a trek, earning Wilderness First Aid and becoming a Leave No Trace Trainer as well as several other requirements. 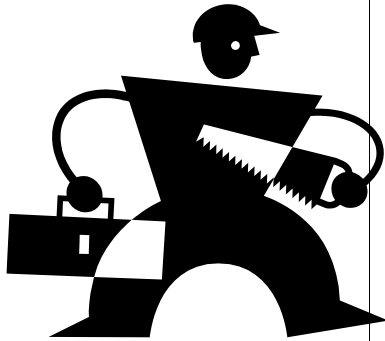
