## Area II Project

A great foundation has been laid by the efforts of the Area 2 project and will be formative in developing a successful future for our council. - A new tool shed was built between Memorial Cabin and Booker Cabin.
- The screens in the Fort and the screen doors at Memorial cabin were repaired and strengthened with hopes they are not torn so easily.
- A new enclosure for the new audio system at the Activities Field.
- Completed the last ¾ of the new ramp to the Council Ring that was started by another group.
- Built a cabinet to cover the furnace in the Camp Operations office and laid a new level floor.
- Finished installing a rubber roof on Sacred Heart Cabin. The inside of the cabin had new plywood walls installed with insulation and a new deck exit for the rear door was built. Constructed an enclosure for the new furnace.
- Building a storage room for mattresses and benches, etc.
- Completed the BB Gun Range and installed a railing.
